

COURSE ANNOUNCEMENT:
HUMANE DOG CAPTURE AND HANDLING
- MAXIMIZING SUCCESS AND MINIMIZING THE FIGHT -
Thomas J. O'Connor Animal Shelter
May 26-27, 2010

Global Wildlife Resources will be teaching a two day course specifically for the animal control officer, shelter worker, and disaster responder. This is the most extensive course in handling fearful dogs. **This is an essential course for professionals addressing hoarding cases, responding to disasters, handling fearful dogs in shelters, assisting with trap/neuter/release programs, and rescuing dogs in general.**

The course instructor is Dr. Mark Johnson of Global Wildlife Resources, Inc. of Bozeman, Montana. Dr. Johnson, former veterinarian of Yellowstone National Park, has participated nationwide in wildlife capture operations and teaches internationally for universities, national parks, and state/federal/tribal agencies.



Course content includes:

and are often profound career experiences for course participants.***

This course is a product of Dr. Johnson's experience handling over 2,000 feral dogs throughout the world including the Caribbean, India, tribal lands, and rescue operations after Hurricane Katrina. He is also author of the Feral Dog Blog and was an instructor for Project Vet train for the government of India Animal Welfare Board.

This unique field-oriented training emphasizes professional and humane animal handling and covers practical techniques to maximize field success and human & animal safety. The course focuses on the needs of animal welfare professionals to understand the skills and equipment associated with capture, physical restraint, and chemical immobilization. This GWR course also trains participants in the use of the Y pole to provide the handler with a compassionate advantage while working with the behavior of the dog.

Class size is limited to 40 participants. The course includes a course notebook and Certificate of Training. The 2-day course fee is \$550 (\$575 after May 1). Places in this course are reserved once payment is received.
